President's Report

I mentioned at the start of the year that my goal for 2020 was working with the membership to define our vision for the future. To put it mildly, we are now at a crossroads and it is time for the membership to voice their opinion of what this vision should be.

While attending a function at their venue, I was casually asked if the Schwaben Club would be interested in purchasing the Slovenian Association (Sava Club) in Breslau; put simply, they wanted to know that if they were to sell, they could sell to a like minded cultural club that would continue to enjoy their home. In April I was informed that they were going to be putting their lands and building up for sale and were open to negotiating with the Schwaben Club prior to advertising on the open market. After discussing the opportunity with the Strategic Planning Committee (appointed by the Sick Benefit at the meeting in 2018) we brought the concept forward to the Sick Benefit members at the meeting on May 27th. In response, the Strategic Planning Committee was asked to do their due diligence on the Sava Club, including arranging an inspection of the venue, so the Sick Benefit can make an informed decision on whether to purchase the lands. Simultaneously, as a second option a separate Special Committee was asked to have a market evaluation done on the present location, while also preparing a long-term business plan for the club assuming we would stay where we are. The business plan will look at how to maximize the revenue generating potential of the present location including recommended upgrades to attract new clientele. Both of these Special Committees will report to the Sick Benefit at our next scheduled meeting on Wednesday June 24th at 7 p.m.

On Saturday June 20th (the original date of our Club Picnic) we will be holding an open house at the Sava Club between noon and 4 p.m. for the entire membership. The building will be open for you to look around (although we will have to restrict how many people can be in the building at a time), and you can walk around the lands at your leisure. I will be situated at the outdoor pavilion to answer questions as best I can, and if you are not a member of the Sick Benefit to receive your comments that I will in turn bring forward on your behalf to the Sick Benefit Association.

I do realize that whatever the Sick Benefit Association decides to do, the decision will not be unanimous and there will be people upset. Rest assured that the decision is not being taken likely, as evidence of the objectives of two different Special Committees. Ultimately, although the means may be dramatically different, the intent of both options is to provide the club with a viably long-term venue at which we as the membership can hold events and share in our cultural heritage.

Our hearts are heavy as we announce the passing of one of our oldest Schwaben Club members, Marion Nuxoll.


2 April, 1921 – 24 May, 2020

She left her sister and grandparents behind and made the long journey to Canada on her own at 17 to join her parents and new brother who had been in Canada for 10 years. Here she learned a new language and experienced a totally unfamiliar lifestyle from that of the old country. There was many a time in the beginning that she asked her parents to go back to Romania but in the end she stayed and was happy with her decision. She started working at Forsyth Shirt Factory in 1938 and eventually moved up to a Supervisor position which she held for 20 years. On May 29th, 1943 she married her true love Herman Nuxoll. Together they raised one child, a daughter, Mary Jane. Marion is predeceased by her husband Herman, daughter Jane (Vince) McQuabbie, her parents John and Katherina, her sister Maria and brother Joe. She is survived by her grandchildren Jason (Heather), Tina, Lena (Glenn) Herold, her great grandchildren Eric (Aftan), Jessica, Nolan, Tye, Shayla, Jayden, and Shane, her great-great grandchildren Emma, Joey, and Aurora, her nieces and nephew and many cousins. She will be dearly missed by all her family and friends. Marion had a love of gardening and cooking. She was often found in the kitchen and her cabbage rolls were a family favourite at holidays! She loved spending time with people - talking and reminiscing - and enjoyed visiting with her extended family whenever she could.
