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Presidents Report

With the weather turning nicer, members are asking what we can and can't do under the present restrictions. As club members, you are always welcome to walk around and enjoy the property; bring a picnic (just no outside alcohol) and a few lawn chairs with you (you can also sit out at a picnic table on the patio or pavilion or even move one out onto the lawn - please move it back when you're done) and enjoy the warm weather. Just remember to keep socially distanced from other households and avoid overcrowding the property based on the restrictions outlined below.

As for organized events, while in the Red (Control) zone we are only allowed to have 5 people inside for social gatherings or 10 people for dinner service, so that is why we are only doing take out events so far. However, we can have up to 25 people outside (limit of 4 people per table); so, as things get nicer, we will be able to start holding outdoor social events, showing soccer games and hosting movies outside on the patio, and consider switching from take out only fundraising events to reserved dining outside with bar service. We will keep everyone posted of changes as best as possible through the Nachrichten and social media.

Should we switch to Orange, we would be able to hold events with up to 50 people inside and 100 people outside; however, since we would still be limited to 4 people per table and 2 metre spacing between tables, we would have to restrict access to what can be accommodated in the hall, or on the patio/pavilion. Again, we will keep everyone posted.

My Oma - By Emma Becker



Ever since I was born my Grandma has been there for me. I call her Grandma because her mom, my great-grandmother, is who I always knew as Oma. Grandma has gone above and beyond for my brother and I, and I love her so much for that. She spoiled us with love, and we knew we could break "rules" which we'd never get away with Mom and Dad. At Grandma's house there was no such thing as too much cake!

As I reflect back on the time we have spent together, specific things have stood out for me over the course of my childhood. I've realized that as I grew, there was a time of "what she did for me" "what we did together" and "what I do now for her and because of her".

Ever since I was able to walk and talk, my Grandma has always taught me the importance of family, traditions and faith. It was always evident to me that food brought people together and that family should always gather each day for dinner and share the meal together. Traditions such as dance, music and the celebrations at the Schwaben Club were a very big part of our lives. Grandma introduced me to the world of dance and how wonderful it was. By the age of four she had me signed up for the Kindergruppe, and I officially became a Schwob! When I was in Senior Kindergarten, I started German school. I knew this was important to my Grandma. She would speak German to my brother and I all the time, but we would never understand. I was in German school until I was in sixth grade, for a total of 7 years. Oh, how I

dreaded it at the time!

One of the most important things Grandma did was to create her Tracht out of fabric that she brought back from Yugoslavia. She is so proud of that Tracht and at different times in our live, each of my cousins and I wore it. I didn't appreciate it. This was mostly because I didn't understand, and I was too focused on the way I looked rather then the reason behind it. It wasn't until many years later, when I travelled to Hungary, that I realized the value and beauty of the Tracht.

As a child one of the most memorable things that my Grandma and I did together was that we danced. Sometimes we would listen to Barney to humour me, but other times, we would listen to polka music. I was so small that I would dance with my feet on hers. I'll always remember her telling me "step two three, step two three" to teach me the basics of how to polka. Grandma and I have always loved to cook together, even when I was so small, I had to stand on a chair We had favourite recipes I know off by heart, thanks to the time we spent together. We'd make Oblate (we call it Plata) Spatzle, fried chicken Schnitzel, and Gurkensalat. I always remember my job was the stirring.

One of my Grandma's favourite past times is looking at old photos. She would show me pictures of her family, and from times long ago, from as she called it "in the old country". Grandma has always enjoyed showing me pictures of her at the club and in the dance group with my Opa. Despite me never being able to meet my Opa, she has always kept his memory alive through sharing the pictures with me.

Now that both of us have gotten older, things have changed. I am able to give back the love that she gave me. I am now the one who speaks German to her (German school paid off!) and I ask her to come dance with me. I now sing our favourite songs to her. I find myself the one making the Gurkensalat and cooking the Spatzle. I'm even the one showing the pictures now. We still love looking at them together. She is happy to see the photos and videos from when I travelled to Europe in 2019, with my friends and I dressed in Dirndl's and Tracht, dancing just like she used to.

I now wear the Tracht because I want to. I know it makes her so proud. I aspire so much to be just like my Grandma. I want to wear the dress that she did when she was my age. I want to become Miss Schwaben, to make her proud. I want to be just like her. She has taught me so much, and I am forever grateful. I am unbelievably blessed to have such an amazing woman help raise me and be in my life. I am the woman I have become, because of my Grandma.
