Presidents Report

This will be my last President's report. It is bittersweet as I have stepped back on my own accord, but it is still difficult to let go of the reins of something that you have put so much into the last few years.

To all those that I worked with on the Board, and to all our other volunteers, it was not easy but we accomplished more in 3 years than could have been imagined. In 2019, our focus was on minimizing our financial losses, and that year we pretty much broke even; it took a lot of hard work, sacrifice, and innovation to accomplish this feat. And had COVID not happened in 2020, we were gearing up to have an impressive (and likely profitable) year.

In 2019, we, as a club, also made great strides in bringing about equality with the constitutional changes. Although some would have preferred abolishing the Sick Benefit membership classification all together, we needed to make progressive steps, and not giant leaps, in order to get many to accept the changes that were being proposed.

In 2020, COVID sidetracked everything and we went into survival mode. Every event involved an optimistic Plan A, a realistic Plan B, and a pessimistic Plan C, as the rules, regulations, and restrictions were constantly changing. I can still vividly remember sitting in the Keller with Kirk talking about what we needed to do to survive the projected 6 weeks COVID was expected to last. The Board and staff deserve great praise for the herculean effort put in to keeping things going as much as we could for our members over the ensuing 21 months. Ultimately however it was fortuitous that the Sava Club had approached us on purchasing their location, because without that opportunity I do not know how well we would have faired financially through COVID.

For 2022, my words of advice for the incoming board are "keep it simple". Let's finish settling into our new home and focus on coming together to share in the Donauschwaben culture with good friends and family.

As a young man, he left his homeland for the pioneering adventure of Canada and the hope to start a new life in a new land. His brother, Ludwig also joined in on the adventure so the two headed off to the promised land.

Life was not easy but opportunities where endless, and as someone with a good work ethic, high standards and common sense, Jakob was able to traverse across Canada and established himself in Calgary, Alberta in 1953. There, he met his first wife Thelma and began his family. He started his working career as a General Contractor and eventually ended up as the Director of Maintenance and Operations at the University of Calgary. He had a straight forward, no nonsense approach to handling huge budgets and projects for the University and became an integral part to the University's growth and success. He built his own house in Calgary and it was a definite reflection of his ideals and sensibilities as it still remains in the family. He had a wonderful workshop where he built exquisite and elegant furniture.

His other passion was fishing. He had a small motorhome and seaworthy boat which allowed him to fish on the West Coast of British Columbia. After a successful day of fishing in a small boat on the Pacific Ocean he would prepare his freshly caught salmon and seal into cans right on their campsite. Jakob had a definite passion for Western Canada as he spent as much time as possible traveling and exploring the mountains and waterways. After the passing of his first wife, Thelma, Jakob began to travel more to Eastern Canada and reconnect with his younger brother, Ludwig. This was a wonderful time for Jakob to establish a new connection with his family and eventually return back home to Austria. He embraced the opportunity to reclaim his first language, culture, fashion and cuisine. He was very comfortable during this stage, but there was still something he was missing. He had travelled with his brother Ludwig and sister-in-law Helma on numerous occasions and was invited to do a pilgrimage bus tour into Quebec. Sitting with Ludwig and Helma on the bus with an empty seat beside him, Cecilia Piller asked if she could join them. This sparked a friendship and eventual marriage to Cecilia in 2013 where the two where virtually inseparable. Jakob and Cecilia's relationship was a true love story at a time when both needed support and companionship and were fortunate enough to find it with each other. It was a wonderful time for them both where they travelled together and became a fixture in the Kitchener/Waterloo community.

Covid 19 struck in the spring of 2020. All gatherings ceased including all our cultural events and Club activities. This continued for most of the year as the Club events were being cancelled month after month. In October 2020, Oktoberfest, our biggest fundraiser of the year was held in a small way and limited to dinner service and take out only.

The selling of 1668 King St. E. in the Fall of 2020 took place with the assistance of the committee set up to handle the sale and purchase of the Club in Breslau. The move to 50 Scheifele Place in Breslau in January 2021 brought a wide range of emotions. There were so many memories - significant events such as marriages and connections to events that had taken place over many decades at the Kitchener location. Many were excited at the prospect of making new memories too. Settling into our building with added green space and acreage that opened a wide range of event opportunities and a place for families to spend their time.
