Sharing our culture and tradition...

The Frauengruppe distributed Rosemary plants to our members as well as our Kinder and Jugend gruppe participants.

This is part of the new tradition started at the former club where each young dancer received their own special Rosemary to care for and grow for the annual Kirchweih celebrations in the fall. Five plants have



also been planted at the club to be taken care of by our new gardening club members.

It is the hope that each plant will represent one of the many Donauschwaben regions our members represent.

Here are a few tips in caring for your plant:

1. Water rosemary plants evenly throughout the growing season but be careful not to overwater.

2. Prune regularly so that plants won't get lanky.

3. For fresh rosemary in the winter, grow the plant indoors in a pot (or take a cutting from an outdoor plant and keep a second indoors). Be sure to put it in bright light and protect it from cold drafts.

4. Rosemary that's grown in the ground does not transplant to containers well, so consider growing it in a container that *can be brought inside during the colder months.*

5. Be sure to get cuttings or divide the plant for next season if it won't survive winter in your area.

This Fresh Lemon and Rosemary Stovetop Potpourri Recipe is a natural air freshener that will make your home smell wonderful! Recipe is taken from Home Cooking Memories:

Lemon and Rosemary Stovetop Potpourri Recipe

2 quarts of water 1 lemon, sliced 2 fresh rosemary sprigs, 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract Optional: 2 cinnamon sticks

- 1. Add all of the ingredients to a large saucepan.
- 2. Place the pan under medium/high heat on the stovetop *until it begins to boil. Reduce heat to low and allow it to* simmer.

The Simmering process releases the fragrance through out the home. (Be sure to replenish the water as it evaporates).





LET'S GET CULTURAL

What does it mean to preserve our heritage/culture? We hear this phrase often.

Cultural preservation is the steps that are taken to make sure that our culture, customs and traditions do not go into extinction. They are the conscious efforts that are taken to make sure that our culture does not vanish from the surface of the earth.

Look at any object in your house, meal you eat, or gesture you use, and you'll find evidence of culture. Cultural traditions and perspectives have shaped who you are. Learn more about them and how you can keep them strong.

Share your culture's art and technology. Each culture has its own clothing, music, visual art, storytelling traditions, and many more unique characteristics. Other members of your culture will be overjoyed to teach or talk about their hobbies, their jobs, their crafts, and what they do for fun. This includes traditional artwork you would find in a museum, but material culture goes far beyond that. Even a kitchen spoon is a cultural artifact.

People with less sophisticated technology are often considered ignorant or less intelligent. This is completely wrong. Culture passes on tools adapted to a particular environment, and every tool has generations of thinking behind it. Shaping a stone tool is one of the oldest cultural practices there is, and it still takes great skill and knowledge.

Attend or organize major events. Your country, or immigrant ethnic group almost certainly celebrate major holidays or cultural festivals.

Cook family recipes. It's never too late to whip up some recipes from your grandmother's cookbook. Smell and taste have powerful connections to memory.[2] As you knead dough or try to guess the right amount of spices, you might remember meals from you childhood or holidays. Just reading a recipe can teach you how much ingredients and kitchen tools have changed. And even if some of them are unfamiliar, others have most likely become your comfort food or a source of family pride. **Tip:** If you don't have family recipes, look for old cookbooks online or at flea markets. You could even start your own by writing down recipes shared orally by your relatives.

Spend time with other members of the community. The best way to preserve your culture is to keep it alive. Gather as a group not just for holidays, but for ordinary meals, events, or just conversation.

Speak your ancestral language. If you know someone who shares your culture, ask them to teach you. Many linguists and anthropologists argue that language

shapes our whole perception of the world

Thousands of languages are at risk of extinction. If you know one of them, teach it to others. Share examples of the knowledge and perspective that would be lost if it goes away. Record the language spoken and written (if possible), and work on translations to less endangered languages.

So, in the category of cultural events which must be preserved, this most definitely includes events held by our Donauschwaben ancestors back in the Old Country. *At this moment in time, our Club has only 2 true heritage events left; Gründungsfest and Kirchweih.*

Gründungsfest is still a viable event. It is wellattended event and is always a good time. Even without the hors d'oeuvres, a much-anticipated perk,

it is still a grand affair. And, there are the Krapfen. They are made by Club volunteers so join the kitchen crew and bring our Krapfen to the table.





Kirchweih, on the other hand, is a greater challenge. It entails a trachten-parade, rosemary plant cultivation by volunteers for the auction with wine chasers and requires a vast amount of enthusiasm and work to bring to fruition. This year, with the co-operation of the Club and the Frauengruppe, we hope to add a few traditional experiences to our Kirchweih.

Don't give up on our Donauschwaben heritage events. Besides being a fun time, they keep our fading culture alive. I hope to see you at our Kirchweih in the fall.

Heritage encompasses tangible and intangible, natural and cultural, movable and immovable and documentary assets inherited from the past and transmitted to future generations by virtue of their irreplaceable value.
