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PRESIDENT'S REPORT

As I am writing this report, we just returned from the Heimat Tour. It was a very aggressive schedule, but we managed everything with minimal hickups (most importantly we did not lose anyone). I think we accomplished the ultimate goals of the trip, which were (A) to better understand how our families lived when times were good, and what they had to endure when times were bad, (B) to realize the resources available to research one's ancestry further, (C) to connect with others Donau- and Banater- Schwaben and hear their stories, and (D) to make some lasting memories.

To the last point, I have asked the participants trip to submit to the Nachrichten а photo and short description of their impactful most moment, being the moment that sticks in their memory. For me, it was a finding the carving shown in the adjacent photo in a small alcove next to a church in Serbia;



I apologize for the photo quality but it was taken through a metal screen. The inscription explains that the "carving symbolizes the emptiness that arose after the mass emigration of Germans from the area (during and after World War 2)".

While in Europe, I also starting firming up details of our next Verband event being dance instructor training with Hansi Mueller from Romania. It is tentatively being planned for 9 days in February 2025; should everything work out, we will need to move Grundungsfest to January, but we would be holding a Fasching event with the training program participants. The instructor training goes beyond just learning traditional dances; it explains choreography, different dance holds and moves, and the history/significance of the various routines. I will keep everyone posted on the details as they progress.

At the club level, we are gearing up for Kirchweih in September and Oktoberfest in October. I hope to see all of you out to at least one of these events.

In 2019, the leadership of the Freundschaftgruppe had the opportunity to join the Welttreffen tour, where we gained invaluable insights. We shared our experiences through photos at Kirchweih and gave two PowerPoint presentations highlighting what we learned. Additionally, we led a workshop on starching underskirts, sharing traditional skills with our community.



When plans were announced two years ago for a Return to Heimat Tour, our group leaders knew we wanted to be part of it once again. Although Shay couldn't attend due to work commitments, the rest of us embarked on another journey to Europe. Participating in this tour was crucial for us as it allowed us to deepen our understanding of Donauschwaben history.

This time, the tour offered deeply personal experiences for many attendees. Throughout Hungary, Serbia, and Romania, we visited various Donauschwaben Clubs, churches, and museums, where our hosts graciously provided unique experiences, historical insights, examples of regional tracht, dance instruction, and delightful local cuisine. Our group also visited several memorials dedicated to the Donauschwaben people. We laid a wreath in Ulm, Germany, at the site where the Donauswabians began their journey down the Danube River to new lands. Another wreath was placed at the memorial cross in Gakovo, honouring those who were exterminated in the former Yugoslavia after World War II. Another wreath was placed in Taksony, Hungary and we were all able to place a lit candle in the monument after their Kirchweih in honour of those that did not return after the war.

These visits, along with the personal stories shared by family members, made the experience deeply emotional for all of us. However, they also reminded us of the strength and resilience of our ancestors, who either left Germany to start a new life or were forced from their homelands

after the war. Their legacy continues to inspire us.

The title has always meant a lot to me personally, and during my reign, I took the title seriously and wore the sash with such pride. Before the trip, I was informed that we would be taking a boat ride down the Donau,



so I brought the sash with me on my trip for the purpose of wearing it on the river. This was very symbolic to me as I felt like I was honouring our families and the journeys/ sacrifices they made in order for us to all be here today. What an honour it was to be Miss Donauschwaben (2023) on the Donau river and to have been one of many ladies who've represented our club, our people and culture. This trip will be something I will cherish forever and continuously reflect on for the rest of my life.



MAGDALENA SORG: Most memorable was in Taksony with their dancers, brass band and local people.

DARLENE CLAUSING: There was so much packed into this trip its difficult to say a best moment. The most impact would be Magdalena's story first at our Tour at Kulturzentrum Haus des Donauschwaben – Haar. Over a map of the old country, again on the bus to Linz she spoke a little more, bringing many of us to tears. In Linz we all walked the bridge, where, as a child she was never able to cross. We were re united with the story when we arrived in the former Yugoslavia. We placed a wreath at the memorial cross. The field to the right holds the thousands whose lives were lost.

I took a lot of pictures of the costumes and patterned-(embroidered) cloths which were so inspiring for future hand work and there was also the Banat Village Museum in Timisoara nicknamed Banat "Pioneer Village".



The many museums we went to provided so much more!

We viewed the houses and when we spent two days visiting m e m o r i a l

sites, the Churches, which, across the 4 countries, were all constructed the same. The architecture for the houses, with the Romanian, Hungarian, Serbian influence in the Schwaben manner, was beautiful.

I loved each site we visited. If anything, we could have spent more time for those visiting their homesteads, to experience more. There is no way to describe the feelings of those visiting their families homes, but two that really enriched the experience for me was The Leipold's, when they found that the family home was over grown with brush. As I picked zwetschge and everyone explored and walked, I think I could have stayed there the entire day! We didn't see much of Croatia, but this made it so beautiful for me.

We visited the home for Brian's family and down the road they spoke of the Kraehling's. Glenn, and a couple of people went to save time. But while they did this. I can't remember who... (Jason, Seppi ??) and I'm sure there was someone else... brought more zwetschgen, where a man had rung a bell to greet us. Unbelievable!

This was more than a once in a life time experience, and I cannot thank the Herald's enough for the time they put into making this possible for all of us.

HELGA PELLER:

We found the church my Mom and her family attended in Sanmartin (Sankmartin) and to experience all this with my one sister and daughter and the rest of the Donauschwabs on the trip made it most memorable. There was a butterfly flying around while we were there and it made me realize that she is at peace.

HEIDI PELLER-OLIVER:

Melchior Peller- born 1938 in Ridica (Sombor), Serbia. Dad to Heidi, Helga and Ingrid. & Opa to Jessica, Tyler & Nick



Heidi has the lot address of Dad's parents house - Koschuth L31 from Peter Peller(Dad's father) death certificate. Pellers had lived here for generations, they owned an acre and a big house.

During the war, Russians came to the home of Peter Peller who was forced and taken away from his home in 1940. His mother, wife and child (Dad was 4 years old) in shock were left behind. We do know that our grandfather was of high ranks of German army, because his cap showed SS army and his large high grave still sits today in St Petersburg (formerly Leningrad). He died in action on the Russian front Oct 5, 1942.

Oma was taken away shortly after about 1944-45 (Dad's Mom Magdelena) was taken from her home in front her child(Dad) and GrossOma (her Mom) to Gakovo (she survived Gakovo) then taken to a Russian concentration camp, she was gone 5 years.

In 1949-50 she came back to Ridica to her home. Meanwhile life went on for GrossOma taking care of Dad who went to school in Ridica until he was 13 in 1951. We have his report cards from his school. In 1951, Oma announced leave all behind they are all going back to Germany. Oma's hair had turned white at age 29. She never spoke of her bad time in the camp. We think she was raped, treated badly and pushed to work hard like most women were by the Russians during the war and at camps. Dad lived in Markgrőningen, Germany with Oma & GrossOma until 1960. John Heffner Sr sponsored Dad to come to Kitchener, Canada, assisted him in finding work and a home. He was told to go to Schwaben Club where he met our Mom and the rest is history.

Heidi, Helga Jessica found the hometown courtesy of our bus driver on the tour. The Peller home was not found, addresses

and lots have changed, the home may be covered in grown over bush. Here is a picture of Dad's church with all of us - it's best we found.

LENA HEROLD: We recently returned from the Return to Heimat Tour, where we travelled through Germany, Austria, Hungary, Croatia, Serbia, and Romania. Our group of 26 were united by a shared love for Donauschwaben culture and traditions. If Glenn and I had undertaken this journey on our own, we might have visited the same places, but the experience would have been entirely different as many doors were opened to us because of our group size.

Throughout our travels, we were warmly welcomed into

Donauschwaben museums and clubhouses across various countries. We enjoyed generous hospitality, delicious food and drink, lively music, and dance. We learned more about our Donauschwaben heritage through their displays, videos, and personal stories.

One of my most memorable moments of the trip was the festival night

in Albstadt, Germany which occurred at the beginning of our vacation. After visiting the Albstadt Donauschwaben Club, its museum, and having some drinks and homemade pretzels there, our host for the evening, Matthias, took us to HockAlbFest. Some of our trip participants had formed a dance group months before and that evening they performed for the crowd. I connected with a family friend who brought me a book about my ancestral village which was a surreal moment. The evening did feature a brass band and later, a contemporary folk group that energized the crowd. The food was fantastic, and we had a blast when we were called up to the dance floor and introduced to the crowd.

The night captured everything I cherished about the Return to Heimat Tour: culture, family, fun, and friendship. I would relive the trip again in a heartbeat. From start to finish each day was so different with its own experiences and when you thought it couldn't get any better it always somehow did. Thank you to Glenn for planning and executing the trip. You did a superb job!
