PRESIDENT'S REPORT

There are two upcoming events just announced by the Weltdachverband that I wanted to let everyone know about. If you want additional information on either of these, please let me know:

1. October 18-20, 2024 International Donauschwaben Congress in Marchtrenk, Austria. There are several presentation talking about history, life and culture.

2. August 2-15, 2025 Fifth Welttreffen der Donauschwaben focusing on Hungary and Serbia. Registration is already open, and a deposit is required to secure your spot. At present, only 4 people are allowed to register per club, with a tour limit of 80 people. Cost is 1800 Euro per person.

As we gear up for Oktoberfest, I thought I would provide you with some Oktoberfest trivia. Did you know the following song, did not originate in Bavaria; it was composed by a journalist in Bremen. It wasn't until 1898 when one of the brass orchestras that performed at the Munich Oktoberfest added it to their repertoire so the crowd could sing along.

Loosely translated, it is a toast to well being (repeated twice). Last line is one, two, three, drink.

German law dictates that only beer brewed within Munich city limits can be served at Oktoberfest; they include Augustiner, Hacker-Pschorr, Hofbräu, Löwenbräu, Paulaner and Spaten. Even though some of these brewers offer Oktoberfest beer, it is not; all brewers are only allowed to serve their official Oktoberfest beer at the festival.

For those wearing a dirndl, how you tie the bow sends a message:

1. Tying your dirndl bow on the right means you're taken.

2. Tying your bow on the left means you're single.

3. utting your dirndl bow in the front/middle is a proclamation of your purity.

For the men, wearing the lederhosen with the flap to the front is traditional; wearing the flap to the back is a sign you may have had too much to drink and need to be cut off.

Albert Einstein once worked as an electrician and helped set up one of the beer tents at Oktoberfest in 1896.

The litre sized glass mugs everyone drinks out of at Oktoberfest are called ma β krug. They are not to be called steins, as steins describe the stone or clay mugs originally used prior to the advent of the glass mugs.

In Munich, there is actually a Verein Gegen Betugerisches Einschenken that visits the various tents to make sure proper beer-pouring techniques are being followed.

All that being said, I hope to see many of you out enjoying the festivities.

I would also like to send out a congratulations to Dave Hein.
