HANS SCHAADT YOUTH CULTURAL AWARD 2025

The presentation speech for the Hans Schaadt Youth Cultural Award, as read by Lisa Schaadt at Gründungsfest, this past February.

Good evening! It is a wonderful feeling to be back at the Club again and celebrating another year of our culture and heritage. Congratulations to the Frauengruppe on celebrating a milestone of 90 years. Gründungsfest has always been one of my favourite events as we get to celebrate us... our Members. We honour where we came from and where we want to go, all with our continued traditions. Rick and I admit we don't know everyone here tonight as we don't make it out much but that is a good thing as it

is a sign that we continue to invite new friends to our Schwaben Family.

I would like to start with a heartfelt thank you from the Schaadt family to those that submitted articles for this year's Hans Schaadt Youth Cultural Award 2025. The topic this year was 'WHY' you enjoy being a part of the Kitchener Schwaben Club. We were blown away after receiving 10 entries this year and I think it is because we can all relate to this topic. Each entry had a common theme of the Club being a safe, comfortable place to dance, eat & make new friends that end up becoming family! Some of the entries stated the club has helped them build confidence in themselves, their ability to dance and also ability to do public speaking! By far this year was my favourite year to read the entries... I could relate to the feelings of togetherness, the love for dance and the love for continuing our culture. Please be sure to check out the entries on the table just outside our hall tonight and we will make sure to post them in the Nachrichten in the months to follow. I love that these articles are now an addition to our archives and will continue to help our youth reflect on their culture and heritage.

This award was developed to honour my late fatherin-law, Hans Schaadt. Hans was a kindhearted, hard working, caring and dedicated Schwaben member. His commitment dates back into the 70s as Youth Director. He served as Kitchener Schwaben Club President and Dachverband of Kanada President for many years. Hans was a man of tradition and held his Schwaben family close to his heart. He was a proud "Schwob" and I know would be proud of us honouring his heritage.

Today marks our 6th presentation of the Hans Schaadt Youth Cultural Award. I have asked one of our participants to read their submission tonight for us. Please welcome our Miss Schwaben Stefanie Kahnke.



Why Do I Enjoy Being a Part of the Schwaben Club? By Stefanie Kahnke

I have considered the Schwaben Club my second home for as long as I can remember, and being a Club member has taught me so much about the German heritage I am so proud to call my own. 17 years ago, when I was three, my mom saw an ad in the paper and forced me to start dancing in the Kindergruppe before I knew what I was getting myself into. I could not be more thankful for this.

Although my family's ancestry does not stem from the Donauschwaben community, I would consider myself an honorary Schwob. This community has been nothing but welcoming to me and my family. Being a member of the Kitchener Schwaben Club has allowed me countless opportunities, such as attending the annual Jugendlagers and Landestreffens, where I have made lifelong friends and memories with people from all over North America. I have also had the opportunity to learn how to cook authentic German and Schwebisch dishes and desserts, such as Wurst, Krapfen, Goulash, cabbage rolls and many more. This also allows me to appreciate and learn about my ancestors, such as my Opi whom I never got the chance to meet. Learning about the history of the Schwaben people and their expulsion from Hungary to then settle along the Danube is eye opening. Swabians were disenfranchised, endured mass exterminations, had their property seized and many were forced into Soviet Union labor camps. Most Swabians resettled in German speaking countries as well as the US, Canada, Brazil, Argentina and Australia.

Recognizing their hardships, will and determination makes me appreciative of the life we currently enjoy and gives me so much gratitude. Oktoberfest has always been one of my favourite times of year- the feeling of Gemütlichkeit, the dancing, the amazing food, family days, getting to meet new people, new experiences, the So You Think You Can Tanz competition, the parade, and everything in between. Over the past year, the title of Miss Schwaben has provided me with so many new opportunities, like touring around in the Air Canada bus with the other Misses to visit all the other German clubs in the city, even getting to dance to Fliegerlied on stage at Bingemans! I never would have had this opportunity without the Schwaben Club. This opportunity of being Miss Schwaben and representing the club in the community has only deepened my love for it. I am so proud of this club and how far we have come, even surviving a location move! We have shown that we are able to experience countless decades of celebrating our culture and heritage, providing a home away from home for our members.

I have also been the Kindergruppe instructor for the last couple years. It has been so incredibly rewarding and has also provided me with the opportunity to be a mentor and leader for the newer generation of Schwobs. Even though I had to step down as the main instructor due to health reasons and school, I am able to see them some weeks and it warms my heart to see their dance abilities strengthen as each week goes on. Even when school gets hard, or my health is in a bad place, there is somewhere I can be myself. Dancing with the Schwaben dancers each week has been the best outlet for exercise, fun and socialization. We have so much fun, and I cannot imagine my life without it (literally I've been dancing since I was three and I can't stop).

I cannot begin to explain everything this club and community has provided for me. I would not be the woman I am today without the connection I have with each and every member of the club and all that I have experienced. Each time I walk in the door, I am always greeted with smiling faces and open arms. Each aspect of the club comes together to create a comforting, traditional, supportive, kind, warm and inviting environment to those who choose to practice their culture (and even those who aren't Schwobs like me!) I have been a part of the club for 17 years, and only alive for 20. This club has been and continues to be a major part of my life and I could not be more grateful for it.

Thank you Stefanie. It definitely feels like a full circle moment for us as I was the one to place that ad in the paper 17 years ago!! It has been a pleasure to see you go from that 3 year old learning to dance to being our Miss and also to helping our Kindergruppe! Thank You!

I would like to continue to acknowledge the remaining participants for this year's Hans Schaadt Youth Cultural Award and ask them to come to the stage when their name is called.

ERIKA HANKE; For Erika the club has been part of her entire life. From dancing in the Kindergruppe, Jugendgruppe, and Schwaben dancers to serving at the bar for the past 6 years! She enjoys Oktoberfest the most as it incorporates both her love for dance and creating memorable moments for our guests by working at the special bar. She describes the Schwaben Club as warm and inclusive, a place she feels welcomed and connected!

SHAY HEROLD; Shay's strong connection to the club would be the opportunity to preserve and share our traditions and culture. They are proud and passionate about their heritage and finds it rewarding witnessing younger generations embracing and carrying forward our customs. From wearing a traditional Tracht, exchanging a story or a warm smile... it's the pride of knowing that they are contributing to something bigger than themselves.

ANGELE KILLINGBECK; Angele started her article off with the most perfect quote. The quote was, "One of the marvelous things about community is that it enables us to welcome and help people in a way we couldn't as individuals." Credit to Jean Vanier. I joined the Schwaben Club under a family membership back when I was twelve years old. During a time where I never realized how much I needed it. I've never really taught dance before and especially not to children but slowly we're figuring it out and they're really getting the hang of it. I love that I get to pass on to them the knowledge I've gained over years of practice and, hopefully, the love of dance. If even just one sticks it out until they're in the Schwaben dancers I will be overjoyed. I want them to have a great experience with dance and with the Club. I also love the fact that I get to show them from this early age that dancing doesn't have to be hard or scary, that they can just shuffle and spin and have fun.



Overall I think the reason why I love dance at the Schwaben Club is because it sort of encompasses everything about the club. It's a safe place to learn (to dance), it's full of wonderful people who have become life-long friends (to dance with), it has activities for all ages (like dancing), there's always opportunities (to dance) and anyone is welcome (to dance). 
